FATHER KEN'S KORNER

During this ongoing anniversary of the Vatican II Council, we continue our exploration of the Vatican II documents as a faith community with...

Dignitatis Humanae
(Declaration on Religious Liberty)

As we approach mid-term elections, *Dignitatis Humanae* has taken on new significance for our society both now and in recent years. The Church made this declaration on religious freedom in a time when Christianity was under threat elsewhere and when the Americas and Western Europe were more friendly toward, or at least more tolerant of, the Christian position. Today, traditional Judeo-Christian values have come under attack in our sector of the world with more alarming frequency, hatred and sophistication. Enemies of the faith have turned to legal maneuvering, cultural attacks in the entertainment media and in the news and political wrangling in the West and, in the East, have resorted to far less subtle acts of violence, intimidation and even genocide. Therefore, it is important that we take a closer look at this 13th document of Vatican II which pays special attention to threats to religious liberty that originate in government. The document argues that all people must be free from coercion, claiming that, "Truth can impose itself on the mind of a man only in virtue of its own truth, which wins over the mind with both gentleness and power" (1). In other words, neither the government nor any other social or human power should act either to coerce or restrict this basic human right. "The Vatican Council declares that the human person has a right to religious freedom...The Council further declares that the right to religious freedom is based on the very dignity of the human person" (2). Because it is a divine gift, neither the government nor any other social, human power has the right to grant it or take it away. This right belongs even to those who do not choose to exercise it (2).


"The search for truth, however, must be carried out in a manner that is appropriate to the dignity of the human person and his social nature, namely, by free enquiry with the help of teaching or instruction, communication and dialogue" (3). This means, by the way, that pursuit of the truth, especially religious truth, also requires freedom of speech and freedom of assembly within "the just requirements of public order" (2-3). These kinds of freedoms are required because a true religious act "cannot be commanded or forbidden" (3). Government, in particular, must avoid treading on religious freedom because the scope of governmental authority is temporal in nature while religion looks beyond the temporal realm. Any act of governmental restriction of the practice of religion is one that involves an overreach of authority. In our own country, separation of Church and state was originally meant as a restriction on government, that it might not force upon its citizens an official state religion instead allowing for the free pursuit of truth among its citizens. Unfortunately, today the government has more often interpreted this rule to mean that somehow the government has the power to ban religious practice from the public forum or even impose its will on the faithful, at times legally forcing them to act in violation of their conscience or religious beliefs. According to this new perversion, government has assumed authority over religion. This new form of overreach was neither envisioned by the Church nor the Founding Fathers of our country. Our current national health care bill is one such example of violation because it forces the faithful who are opposed to surgical sterilization, artificial birth control and abortifacients to pay for them in the form of a tax. On the other end of the scale, when the government acts to prevent the mention of God or the use of prayer at public school events, in the military branches, etc. they also err.

Religious freedom also requires the free public expression of its beliefs, whether through words or expression and the ability to enter into peaceful dialog with others (5). This might include the display of crèches or other seasonal religious symbols, entering into peaceful debate in the public square, etc. It also means that parents, for instance, have the right to determine the practice of faith that they will exercise at home with their children and the freedom to pursue or not pursue faith based education for them. It is the government's role to protect these rights and not to prohibit them (6). "From this it follows that it is wrong for a public authority to compel its citizens by force or fear or any other means to profess or repudiate any religion or to prevent anyone from joining or leaving a religious body... Furthermore, since civil society has the right to protect itself against possible abuses committed in the name of religious freedom the responsibility for providing such protection rests especially with the civil authority... However, this must not be done in an arbitrary manner or by the unfair practice of favoritism" (6-7).

The Vatican II Council concludes that "man's response to God by faith ought to be free" (10). It must never be forced, as we are seeing at present in the Middle East, or forbidden, as we see in China and in other communist nations. However, it is no longer wise or safe to continue to assume that violations to religious liberty are things that go on "out there". More and more, they are beginning to happen within the boundaries of our own country. Keep this in mind as elections draw near because, as the old saying goes, "You get the kind of government you deserve". For those of you who are qualified to vote, I urge you to make your voice count and bring your faith to the ballot box in order that our religious liberties might continue to be protected.

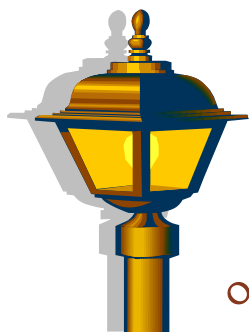
ST. VINCENT DE PAUL NEWS
