FATHER KEN'S KORNER

During this ongoing anniversary of the Vatican II Council, we continue our exploration of the Vatican II documents as a faith community with...

Presbyterorum Ordinis

(Decree on the Ministry and Life of Priests)

This document opens by acknowledging that the priesthood of the Church had already been treated in some detail in a number of the other Vatican II documents, especially in discussing the liturgy, the nature of the Church and training of future priests. However, due to the increasingly complex nature of pastoral ministry in the modern world and the rapidly changing role of the ordained minister, the council decided to write one final document in order to treat this subject with greater depth.

The Priesthood in the Church's Mission: Although all members of the Church share in its mission, ordained ministers are chosen from among the people to maintain holy order within the Church, to forgive sin and provide for the sacramental needs of God's people and, particularly, to proclaim the Gospel and consecrate the Eucharist (i.e. to offer the Mass). Those who were originally chosen were known as the apostles and the bishops of the Church today are their direct successors. "The function of the bishops' ministry was handed over in a subordinate degree to priests so that they might be...co-workers of the Episcopal order" (2). These men have been set apart for a sacred purpose "but this is not in order that they be separated from that people or from any man, but that they should be completely consecrated to the task for which God chooses them" (2).

The Ministry of Priests: The first task of a priest is to preach the Gospel. "Priests...owe it to everybody to share with them the truth of the Gospel...In every case their role is to teach not their own wisdom but the Word of God and to issue a pressing invitation to all men to conversion and to holiness" (4). In this, they fulfill their function to teach God's truth. Priests are also called to sanctify and they do this by leading the faithful in prayer and by faithfully celebrating of the sacraments, especially the Eucharist. In this way, they share in the priesthood of Jesus Christ (5). Finally, priests are called to govern. In governing, they are asked to be especially mindful of the poor and most vulnerable and of the building up of the faith community as a whole (6). It is critical that in exercising

these three functions (teaching, sanctifying and governing) that they remain united to one another and to their bishop. The priest owes obedience to their bishop and his successors under whose authority they act and the bishop, in their turn, should treat their priests as brother and friend (7-8). As regards their connection with the laity, the priest should exercise their leadership not to their own advantage but for the greater glory of God. They should further remember that they are a priest for the people but a fellow disciple with them (9).

The Distribution of Priests / Priestly Vocations:

Priests, first of all, are ordained to help provide for the needs of the universal Church. For this reason, bishops and priests should be generous in responding to other nations or dioceses where clergy are in more scarce supply. Dioceses and nations must always be engaged in the work of providing clergy for the missions both at home and abroad. The laity must also do their part in praying for and promoting vocations both within their own families and parishes to help insure that God's flock will always have a sufficient supply of shepherds (10-11).

The Life of the Priest: All Christians are enabled by the grace of baptism and obligated by their calling to seek a life of holiness. But priests are especially obligated to do so because, through their ordination, they "are made the living instruments of Christ the eternal priest" (12). The daily work of the priest forms the very pathway to growth in the life of holiness and the fruitfulness of their ministry depends upon it. This is especially true through daily prayer (especially the Liturgy of the Hours) and reflection on sacred scripture, as well as being generously available to celebrate the sacraments frequently (13-14). The virtues that are especially essential to the priestly ministry are humility and obedience that the priest might always be mindful of their own weakness and that they seek not their own will but the will of God in all they do (15). Celibacy and voluntary poverty / simplicity of life are also designed to be great helps for the priest, insuring their availability to God's daily call to service (16-17). And "let priests remember that in carrying out their task they are never alone but are supported by the almighty power of God" (22). 
