I want to take the opportunity this weekend to launch a new series for this space beginning next weekend. The series, will be catechetical in nature and all of the questions will come anonymously from you, the parishioners. This idea was inspired by a project spearheaded by our Spiritual Life Committee who brought me a series of questions on the sacrament of reconciliation. It turns out, not surprisingly, that some had issues or difficulties with confession but many were uncomfortable bringing up their questions or difficulties publicly. I took on the challenge of addressing these anonymous issues for the benefit of the community and two things happened. First, many gave me positive feedback that the insert was educational and informative and should be done again on a variety of other topics. Second, some of you privately admitted to me that you had the same issues or questions but did not have the courage to bring them up with someone. I have heard your feedback and am open to the challenge! However, in order for this to work long-term, I will be relying on you for material/questions. So let me know what has always puzzled you about our faith. Let me know about the difficult teachings of our faith that cause you the most distress or anxiety. Let me know what you are confused about and I will do my best pastorally to clear things up. You can get your questions to me in one of three ways:

- 3) Speak to me by appointment or after any Mass.

All of your questions will remain anonymous and remember...if you are thinking about it or struggling with it, chances are many others are too. So be generous and allow others to benefit from your questions also.


SACRED HEART ANGELS FINALLY TRIUMPH AGAINST GYM JONES! 8-6


Good things come to those who wait...and play well.

FAMILY FAITH SHARING QUESTIONS

June 28 Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time Mark 5:21- 43

In today's gospel reading from Mark, we hear about two of Jesus' miracles. A synagogue official named Jairus goes up to Jesus, falls at his feet and pleads for Jesus to come and heal his young daughter, who is dying. As Jesus goes with Jairus, a woman (who has been hemorrhaging - or bleeding - for twelve years) comes up behind Jesus and touches his cloak. No doctor has been able to cure her and she believes that if she can just "touch the cloak of Jesus" she will be healed. And this is just what happens -- her bleeding stops. Jesus is aware that "power" has gone out of him and asks who touched his clothing. She tells him the truth, and he tells her that her faith has saved her, and that she is cured. Jesus then goes to the home of Jairus, where people are wailing and crying and saying that the girl has died. But Jesus says to "just have faith," and then goes inside, takes her hand and tells her to "rise." She immediately stands up and walks around - to the astonishment of everyone present.
