**MISSIONARY COOPERATIVE
PLAN APPEAL**

St. Patrick's Missionary Society, (also known as St. Patrick Fathers) was formally established on March 17, 1932. The Society was founded by Irish Diocesan priests who initially had gone to work on a temporary basis in Nigeria, West Africa, but who later wished to dedicate their lives fully to the Missions. Later as the new missionary society grew, more work was undertaken, not only in Nigeria but also in Kenya (1951), Brazil (1962), Malawi (1970), Grenada (1970), Zambia (1973), Sudan (1983), Zimbabwe (1989), Cameroon (1989) and Homelands of South Africa (1989). In the United States the Society has one house in Chicago. Their address is:
8422 W. Windsor Ave. Chicago, IL 60656-1452.

A few society priests work in dioceses in the United States. There are now 300 priests in the society, of which 21 are newly ordained African priests. After a drop in vocations in recent years, there are now more than 64 preparing for the priesthood in information centers in Nigeria, Kenya and South Africa. Most of the people among whom we work are extremely poor, and we have no means of training our seminarians and supporting our priests in their work other than the donations we receive.
 Father Michael Madigan of the St. Patrick Fathers, will be the celebrant at all English Masses this weekend. A second collection will be taken up for the mission work of St. Patrick Fathers.

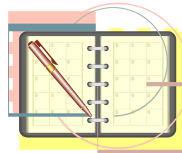

**SHARING OUR FAITH SHAPING OUR FUTURE
ARCHDIOCESAN 5 YEAR CAMPAIGN**

We are starting into the fourth year of the Sharing Our Faith Shaping Our Future (SOF) capital campaign and the following update of all parish and mission activity recorded to date has been provided by the Archdiocese. Because of the efforts of so many throughout the Archdiocese, over \$31,739,140 in gifts and pledges from 15,728 parishioners, staff and priests have been received. This represents 63.5% of the original goal. The willingness of our donors to invest in their Church demonstrates that discipleship is alive and well.

At Sacred Heart Parish, 334 donors have pledged or donated \$563,282 toward our parish goal of \$1,158,348. This represents a 21% participation rate. 25% of the money received will come back to the Parish. Thank you for your generosity.

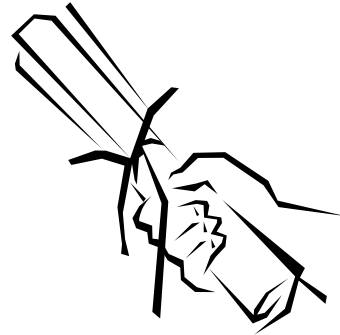

WHY IS THE GOSPEL READ BY ONLY THE PRIEST OR DEACON AT MASS?

The fourfold Gospels hold a unique place in the Church, as is evident both in the veneration which the liturgy accords it, and in the surpassing attraction it has exercised on the saints at all times. There is no doctrine which could be better, more precious and more splendid than the text of the Gospel.

Lectors or readers are entrusted with the first reading in daily Mass or the first and second reading at Sunday Mass, or other major feasts. Lectors are never allowed to proclaim the Gospel or preach the homily; that is entrusted to a deacon, priest or bishop.
