FIRST READING: Acts of the Apostles 2:1-11 (63C)

SECOND READING: 1 Corinthians 12:3b-7, 12-13 GOSPEL: John 20:19-23

### FATHER KEN'S KORNER

**Q:** Is there any restriction about how long an extraordinary Eucharistic minister to the homebound may keep possession of the Eucharist? If so, what are the guidelines?

**A:** Yes there is a restriction which can be logically drawn from canon law regarding the placement of tabernacles and the authorized reservation of the Eucharist either on one's own person or in unapproved locations. Canon 934 says that every cathedral and parish must reserve the Eucharist (in a proper tabernacle meeting the description of Canon 938). Other chapels, oratories and pious houses (e.g. associated with religious orders, retreat facilities, hospitals, rectories, houses of clergy formation, etc.) may do so as well but only with the permission of the local ordinary. I know of several parish priests in our archdiocese, for example, whose rectories contain small prayer chapels and who have successfully been granted permission to reserve the Eucharist there. Extraordinary ministers of the Eucharist, when given permission to bring communion to the sick or homebound carry the Eucharist in a special decorative container called a pyx. The pyx is essentially a mobile tabernacle of sorts which is used for purposes of delivery only and not for long-term reservation of the Eucharist. The minister is to immediately distribute the hosts they are carrying to the proper recipients after Mass or after having obtained the Eucharist without running other errands or carrying out other unrelated business. If there is any remainder of the precious species, they are to return it to the parish tabernacle they received it from as soon as possible and certainly within the same day. Any time the Eucharist is kept overnight or longer in their residence (without the bishop's express permission) or on their person they are essentially actively reserving the Eucharist in their home or on their person without the bishop's permission (in violation of Canon 934 or 935 respectively). This should always be avoided.

**Q:** I'm in a wine appreciation class and I'm doing a presentation on the use of sacramental wine. I was wondering what type of wine we use during Mass, and what the restrictions are on selecting sacramental wine.

**A:** Catholic Church Canon Law regulates what is considered the valid matter for our Eucharistic celebrations in terms of both unleavened bread and wine. In terms of the wine we are allowed to use Canon 924.3 states, "The wine must be natural, made from grapes of the vine, and not corrupt." Traditionally this has been interpreted to mean that: the fermentation process must be natural, the wine must be pure grape wine (either red or white) and it must be alcoholic in nature (ranging from some minimal level (mustum) if the priest has requested a dispensation due to alcoholism all the way up to a maximum of 18% alcohol content. Our parish uses an 18% fortified wine called Angelica. It is a sweet, white wine. Other parishes choose a dry wine but, by taste, most congregations prefer a sweeter wine. I have been involved with two parishes that changed labels and selected their new supply via an open tasting and a vote from the people. Angelica, originally produced by the Christian Brothers of Napa Valley in California, is a selection under the Mount La Salle Altar Wine label. Mount La Salle, now commercially owned since 1989 (Heublein Inc.) was founded in 1882, was relocated to Napa Valley in 1930 and is the oldest producer of altar wines in North America. During prohibition, altar wines were the only wines that were allowed to be produced and sold for a time.


