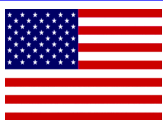
Assessing Our Campus Facilities

Last week I mentioned to you all that an initial archdiocesan process is being set in place in order to make a more long-term assessment of the pastoral needs of Southern Oregon. I also mentioned that the Archbishop has suggested that, although this process will take significant time he hopes, in the end to produce a model that can be replicated in the other regions of the archdiocese. He also assured me when I met with him that if he determines that there is a real need for another parish in Southern Oregon, it will not fall on our parish to help finance it. Put another way, he assured me that our financial resources from our recent property sale are ours alone to use as our faith community sees fit. I added that, of those resources, I have committed 10% to charitable works. This leaves us with an additional process of determining how best to use the other 90% in long-term investment and investment in our own facilities and programs. This week I promised to mention some initial steps that we are taking to assess our own campus facilities.

1) On the advice of the town hall sessions that we held that urged us to prioritize taking care of the facilities, we already have we hired Peter Meijer Architect PC to do a full assessment of our church building. In the past we had addressed failing systems only as circumstances were forced on us. For example we upgraded fire safety, looked into church flooding and roof repairs, and upgraded our

electrical capacity and we are enhancing exterior lighting of the church this year. These types of repairs have either been safety related or as a result of system failures. However, we have never proactively tried to put together a long-term maintenance schedule or budgeted for major future repairs that we will likely face down the road until now. The company we hired specializes in churches and historic buildings and so we felt that their expertise was what we needed. After thoroughly examining our church building, they prepared a report for us in March and last week they gave a full report to our building commission regarding everything from windows to roof flashing to interior wall conditions. It also includes bigger ticket items like what it might cost to do earthquake upgrades. Ultimately, they flagged every area in need of maintenance and repairs and assigned a priority rating to each. They will follow this up with one further report with cost estimates and recommended timetables for repair. This will be the blueprint that we will operate from for decades to come so that our parish may remain in safe operating condition.

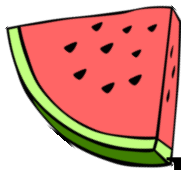
2) In order for us to consider any building projects, remodeling or even demolition work we must also complete a 25 year master plan of our entire campus according to the guidelines set out by the Archdiocese. In my mind this would especially include taking a closer look at our school gym as a whole and our clergy residences as well as giving a significant facelift to our school building. I hope to select an architect this summer to begin this work. This will likely take many months but, as I say, we cannot even entertain taking on any major construction until this process is first complete and, once done, it must be submitted to both archdiocesan and city officials for approval as well. As progress is made further updates will be provided. Overall, our goal is to lead us out of reactionary mode and to help us more accurately budget and raise funds in order to meet the facilities needs of our parish for future generations.

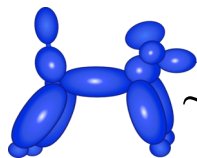
