### FATHER KEN'S KORNER

#### The Forgotten Virtue of Hope

As this new year begins to unfold we strive to look ahead in hope and to look back with gratitude on the blessings of this past year of 2016. However, it is in looking back on 2016, in particular that we are told a majority of Americans consider 2016 to have been a "bad year". In fact, the New York Times even asked the question in one of its recent headlines, "2016: Worst Year. Ever?". This is not the only major publication saying so. Various sources point to the doubling of war deaths, the instability of the Middle East, the tripling of terrorist attacks especially in Europe and on US soil, a downturned economy and conflicted politics both at home and abroad. Even on the entertainment front, it has been pointed out by many about the higher than normal death toll among significant artists, athletes and world figures. Of course this pessimistic attitude is either diminished or increased based on personal perspective and attitude but it should not be so for we who are people of faith. We must pray to have the eyes to see God's hand at work in all things and to see hidden blessings even in the shadow of the cross. In fact, it can be part of the gift we are able to give to the world by reflecting an attitude of gratitude especially among those who apparently can see nothing good occurring. And as we count our blessings of the past year let us also commit to look forward to this new year of 2017 with a spirit of hope.

Hope is the forgotten virtue but St. Paul tells us that it is one of the three theological virtues whose beginning and fulfillment are found in God. The Catechism of the Catholic Church defines hope as "the confident expectation of divine blessing and the beatific vision of God" (CCC 2090) and it is just this confident expectation of divine blessing that the world is so greatly in need of. So let us commit this cause to our prayers as we move into this new year.

And let us also guard against the errors and sins against hope in this new year. According to #2091 in the Catechism, the first sin against hope is despair. When we give up hope, for instance in attaining salvation or forgiveness we offend the Lord who is all good and who is faithful to his promises.

The second sin against hope is presumption (#2092.). This presumption comes in two forms. First we presume against hope by hoping only in our own ability to save ourselves "without help from on high". Second, we do it by trusting in God's mercy and "hoping to obtain his forgiveness without conversion and glory without merit." Our hope is in the Lord who made heaven and earth, according to Sacred Scripture. It is not in our own abilities, in luck, in a political party or in any other earthly power. So in 2017, "trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding. In all ways be mindful of him and he will make straight your paths." Hope in the Lord is the one hope that never disappoints. Be a prophet of hope in this new year for those who lack it and for those who do not know the one true God from whom all hope comes. Blessings on you and yours for the new year!

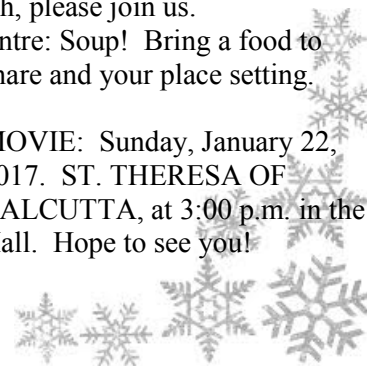

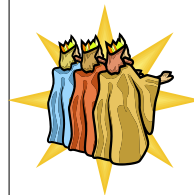
